Project LIFT (Literacy Inspired by Families and Technology) not only provides students with iPads, hotspots, case and headphones to use at home with Achieve 3000 Literacy and ST Math programs, it provides access and training to teachers, student's parents and families as well. It all started with the brainstorming of solutions for English Learner Students at risk of becoming Long Term English Learners by LMSVS District Director of English Learner Services Elisa Holston-Arteaga and Director of Technology Cara Serban-Lawler. Dedicated, they kept going until they had the resources to support this program in two schools. Parent workshop attendance and Incentive and recognition celebrations for students have highlighted that goals are being met.
